(Optional) Problem Set 6

1. (6 points) Variants of IP

Let IP₁ be the class obtained if we change the soundness error of IP from 1/3 to 0, leaving the completeness error unchanged. Let IP₂ be the class obtained if we change the completeness error of IP changed from 1/3 to 0, leaving the soundness error unchanged. What are the classes IP₁ and IP₂; i.e., how are they related to IP and other classes we have studied? Justify your answers.

- 2. $(3 \times 6 = 18 \text{ points})$ For each of these statements, indicate whether it is true, it is false, or we do not know. In each case, justify your answer.
- (a) If R is a regular language and N is a non-regular language, then N-R is always non-regular.
- (b) If L_1 and L_2 are in NL, then $L_1 L_2$ is in NL.
- (c) For any two languages L_1 and L_2 in NP, if $L_1 \leq_P L_2$, then $L_2 \leq_P L_1$.

3. (6 points) Maximum independent set

An independent set of a graph G = (V, E) is a subset S of V such that no two vertices in S have an edge between them in E. It is well known that the following language is NP-complete.

 $\{\langle G, k \rangle : G \text{ has an independent set of size } k\}$

Show that if P = NP, then a maximum independent set of any graph can be found in polynomial time.
